


As part of our Patient Perspectives we are delighted to share Andrea's St Mark's Story



"I was grateful to be referred to St Mark's in 2017 when I required further surgery following 14 years of battling with Indeterminate Colitis. I had previously undergone emergency surgery to remove my Colon and had a temporary lleostomy Stoma formed. The recovery was traumatic causing PTSD, and did not resolve my disease activity.

I was met by the IBD support team and with their care and support, Dr Warusavitarne agreed I was a candidate to have surgery to form and connect an internal JPouch, including removal and closure of my Stoma.

My surgery went ahead in August 2017, however, despite this, I continued to have chronic cuffitis and frequent flares of pouchitis which became resistant to treatment. I was again

suffering extreme pain, incontinence and the impact on my social, mental, and personal health was apparent to all.

After many agonising months and numerous investigations by the amazing St Mark's team, it was agreed my quality of life was being compromised to an extent that further surgery was my only option.

In Feb 2020, my surgeon removed my J-Pouch, carried out a total Proctectomy (removal of closure of the anus site aka a Barbie Butt), and formed a permanent Ileostomy Stoma. This is now where I will stay!

I have my Ileostomy Stoma (Fred the 2nd) which again has saved my life! I had complications recovering but am now healthy and fighting back full force. I have started a new career working in a secondary school as a Teaching Assistant and am looking forward to planning my wedding as soon as Covid restrictions allow.

My family and I can now enjoy life, spending time kayaking, cycling and enjoying the great outdoors, all things that have been impossible in previous years.
