### Fighting for a future free from the fear of bowel disease - Toby's story

At just six years old, Toby was diagnosed with Peutz-Jeghers Syndrome (PJS), a vury rare polyposis syndrome that is usually inherited, silhough it can occur spontaneously. People with PJS develop polyps throughout the gut (anywhere between the mouth and the anus) which have the potential to cause fatal blockages and become cancerous

Toby has undergone dozens of operations to monitor and remove polyps. At least two of these planned and emergency operations have been life-saving.

In December 2017, Toby underwent a seven hour operation which involved the removal of four polyps, the longest one measuring 4.5cm. Toby's mum, Rachel, explains: "5t Mark's assembled a team of world leaders in this specialist field to perform the most difficult and precise surgery on Toby, doing everything they could to avoid open surgery which is associated with several complications, including death. It was only later that they told us how wornied they had been for Toby." Thank you to everyone who responded to our 2018 seasonal appeal, featuring Toby's story of his ongoing experience with St Mark's Hospital.
