## James and his Feb-row-ary challenge!!



St Mark's patient James has undertaken a mammoth 'Feb-row-ary' challenge of rowing 13.5km every day, totalling an impressive 378km, which represents the number of polyps removed from James dissected bowel after an operation at St Mark's. James was diagnosed with Familial Adenomatous Polyposis in 2015 following a colonoscopy, and successfully underwent a restorative proctocolectomy in 2016. As part of his recovery and adjusting to life post-op, James found that building up his fitness helped improved not only his physical health, but more importantly, it was massively beneficial in improving his mental health and well-being. This year, during the continued lockdown, James was motivated to take on this challenge as an opportunity to reflect on his health journey, as a demonstration of the gratitude to those involved in his care and, as a way to help inspire others who find themselves in a similar situation.
